Holiday Tips To Reduce Your Risk of Food Poisoning from Salmonella:

Eggs can be sources of Salmonella, a leading source of food poisoning. The larger the number of Salmonella present in the egg, the more likely it is to cause illness. But eggs, like poultry, meat, milk, and other foods, are safe when handled properly. Store eggs in the shell in the refrigerator. Keeping eggs adequately refrigerated prevents any Salmonella present in the eggs from growing to higher numbers, so always keep eggs refrigerated until you are ready to use them. Always cook eggs thoroughly, and consume them promptly. Have a safe, happy, and healthy holiday!
