**Mayor Coleman Announces
Neighborhood Pride's 15th Season
Four Neighborhoods in 2014**

A new season is gearing up for Neighborhood Pride, the City's initiative to engage residents, businesses and volunteers to clean-up, fix-up, beautify and strengthen residential areas.

In addition to the streets being swept, potholes filled, catch basins inspected and repaired, Neighborhood Pride week hosts a variety of community events including a Neighborhood Safety Academy on Tuesday night, a Community Bike Ride on Wednesday night and Mayor Coleman's Community Night on Thursday Night. A Bicycle Safety Festival will be held at the neighborhood elementary school and select students will be chosen to participate in the Neighborhood Pride Talent Search.

Neighborhood Pride is a partnership between residents and the City of Columbus, created by Mayor Coleman in 2000, spurring City Departments to bring a wide variety of coordinated neighborhood services into specific areas for a week. In Pride's first fourteen years, 80 neighborhoods were serviced and more than 68,222

parcels inspected, 2,195 streetlights repaired, 1,307 tons of bulk trash has been picked up, 27,263 catch basins inspected, and 8,066 fire hydrants painted during Pride weeks.

On August 2nd, Neighborhood Pride and Franklin County Children's Services will present FamJam at Mayor Coleman's Block Party at the Columbus Commons from 10am-3pm. This family friendly event will feature food, fun, and wellness demonstrations.
